A look at Lenten traditions

Each year, the Christian church embarks on a forty-day journey leading up to Easter, known as the season of Lent. When discussing Lenten liturgical practices of Lutherans, I believe one can distinguish three different categories into which each practice can be placed: Visual, Historical/Traditional, and Emotional/Spiritual. It can be debated; however, that some of the practices fall into multiple categories—and rightfully so.

The first visual component is that of the color purple that adorns the Lord's house in various manners throughout the season of Lent. The dye to make purple was very difficult to source in ancient times, thus attributed to royalty, and adorned the Christ only once—as He was mocked and ridiculed as the "King of the Jews" prior to His gruesome crucifixion. This deep hue has come to represent solemnity, penitence, and prayer as God's people meditate on the agony His Son willingly endured. Twice in the Lenten season, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, the Lord's house may be adorned with the color black which represents the absence of light and the curse of sin and darkness which fell over creation that only the death of the perfect Son of God could abolish.

The second visual component is that of the sign of the cross applied upon the repentant Christian's forehead during the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Typically utilizing ash created by the burning of palms from the previous Palm Sunday, this symbolic rite is a reminder of the sign of the cross that was placed on us in our Baptisms, our mortality ("Remember: you are dust, and to dust you shall return."), and the filth of our sin that has been washed clean by the blood of Jesus.

A historical/traditional component of the Lenten season is the omission of the word "Alleluia" from the liturgy and hymnody as well as an omission of the Hymn of Praise. "Alleluia"—a Hebrew word meaning "Praise the Lord"—returns full-voice in the glorious celebration of Easter morning. A long-standing practice at Our Savior in Hartland is the singing of a remarkably beautiful setting of "Farewell to Alleluia" by Olin Jones. As the conclusion to the Transfiguration of Our Lord service, the anthem wafts from the mouths of the *Cantate* choir in the balcony at the rear of the nave and greets the ears of the congregants below as they kneel in solemn reverence and meditation—marking a poignant transition into the holy time of Lent/Easter.

A historic service, the Great Vigil of Easter, on the eve of Easter Sunday, had fallen out of common practice, yet is recently experiencing a resurgence. The service—which is centered on the themes of darkness to light, and God's rescue of His people—includes the Services of Light (including the Kindling of a New Fire), the Word, Holy Baptism, and the Holy Eucharist.

As mentioned earlier, the emotional/spiritual character of the Lenten season is one of penitence. Connected to the Great Vigil of Easter; however, the season of Lent may also be one of preparation, as catechumens who had been prepared, were appointed to be baptized during the Service of Holy Baptism in the Easter Vigil service.

The practice of fasting (or "giving something up") during Lent is not required for Lutherans because it is not commanded in Holy Scripture. Rather, as a matter of Christian freedom, starving oneself of a pleasure of the flesh is a way to remember daily the great sacrifice of Jesus on the cross to pay for the world's sin.

You may already be well-along your Lenten journey. May it be a blessing to you as you again experience the depth of Jesus' obedience and the great love of God to redeem a world so desperately in need of salvation.

Rentals – Prairie street's hot water heater wasn't functioning properly. Ed's Plumbing came out and replaced the heating element.

Church – The leaking roof returned in the Fellowship room in two different areas. Both areas are where the roof drains are installed. The drains are high points in the roof instead of low points, so we get lots of standing water. As long as it remains below freezing the roof won't leak. Due to the snow on the roof it is not feasible to try and do a repair. We will need to place buckets to catch water when it starts to thaw and maybe attempt to divert the water so it doesn't run down the wall. When it is possible to get a good look at the roof we will get bids to repair and possible redo the roof. The last meeting there was discussion about the condition of the parking lot. We will add it to the list of things for 2023. Below is the current list. Please let us know if you have other things, you think we should be looking into. The list is not in any priority order.

Items for 2023:

- At least one new camera for recording services. Could be up to 3.
- Wax the Fellowship and kitchen floor.
- Paint the basement stairs hallway and do any touch needed.
- Add an electric circuit on the outside kitchen wall.
- Lobby carpet, repair or replace.
- Prairie Street rental add electrical outlets and switches in the 3 bedrooms.

Bethany Church Council Meeting January 18, 2023

Financial Secretary's Report- Approved as written

Trustee's Report- This was a busy year for the Trustees with much needed maintenance completed and some upgrades. Below is a summary of the larger items done this year:

Rentals – Prairie street rental had windows repaired, carpet replaced, holes in sheetrock repaired and some plumbing issues resolved. Overall the house is in good working condition, but probably needs future window replacement, electrical outlets and switches added and some landscaping. The South 6th street rental had some water in the basement and was resolved by repairing downspouts. The large picture window was also repaired and painted. This window will need replacement in the next couple of years.

Church - The entire outside of the Church was caulked and painted. This includes caulking of some hairline cracks in the bricks. The roof leaked over the Fellowship room and that was repaired. We attempted to fix the sloping back cement stairs by mud jacking them, but this was unsuccessful. Instead. we caulked up all the cracks and will monitor for additional sloping. When the steps start sloping worse, we will need to look at replacing the steps or building wood steps over the top. Some ceiling fans were replaced. The boiler is in good working condition, but needs to be checked yearly. At the beginning of the heating season the boiler wasn't working due to a seized pump and a defective pump. The final repair was to replace a pump and fuse. They were able to free up the seized pump and if we keep it oiled with the yearly check, it should last for several more years. We have at least two radiators not working but it is for small specific areas, and we chose to not fix them at this time. We also added several smoke detectors and two additional CO2 detectors throughout the Church. The following audio/visual equipment was replaced: projector, wireless mic system and the laptop. We went through an insurance review for underwriting. After numerous issues with the cleaning service, we started with a new company on 11/14/22. A Trustee Handbook was created to assist current and future Trustees with the working of the Church. An on-line version will be available through the Church secretary and a hardcopy will be kept in the sound system cabinet in the lobby. Some items for 2023 are at least one new camera for the recording of services. We currently have 3 working in unison to have coverage of the whole Church. Wax the Fellowship floor and paint the basement stairs hallway. We will also get a bid on the lobby carpet to see if it can be repaired to remove the sagging in areas or if we are looking at a full replacement.

Elder's Report-No New Report

Education Report- Kay mentioned the children are enjoying reading the Bible and learning the books of the Bible through a game called Bible Trivia. They continue to practice memory work also. We would like to encourage all members of the church to invite other children to join us at Bethany. We welcome all new children to Sunday school.

Discipleship Board Report- Monetary donations were made to several organizations. To date \$1505.00 was given to Mission Central, \$6,000 00 to Mission Relief. Other generous donations were made to the Lake City Food Shelf.

Cemetery Board- A discussion was held regarding moving the shed to a different location away from the Cremation plots. Perhaps to the front near the cemetery sign. More discussion will be held.

Pastor's Report- Sign-up sheets for Pastoral Visits will be in the Narthex after Easter for members to request a home visit with Pastor. Please see Pastor if you have with any questions.

Chairman's Report- Elections of officers will be held in April. Please prayerfully consider volunteering for an office. See a council member for more information

Old/New Business- Pastor and Vicki will continue to be Bethany's synodical representatives and acting voters. A committee is needed to plan Bethany's 75th Anniversary Celebration in November. Everyone is welcomed to help with this special occasion. Please see Sue Blumberg for more information. Prayer partners are wanted for 3 confirmation students. There is Not a lot of personal time commitment needed. Please consider this worthy opportunity.
