Sermon by Rev. Dale Kohrs 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary – Saint Peter's Belvidere September 24, 2023 Hebrews 13:8

<sup>8</sup>Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

Each of us reacts differently to change. Some people thrive on it. They look forward to doing things in a new way. They are always ready for new jobs, new furniture, new cars, new experiences. Others of us – and I am one – are reluctant to change. We like things the way they are. We want things to change only if there is a reason for a change. We don't want the living furniture arranged differently unless that new recliner takes more room and something has to give – we don't want the furniture rearranged "just because" someone wants things to be different. We are content to stay at the same job unless the job decides it no longer needs us. For some, change is unwelcome.

Our text reminds us that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ does NOT change. He is the same today as He was yesterday. He is the same today as He will be tomorrow. He is the same for eternity. Our God is eternal and we are reminded about the awesomeness of the One who has created us, preserved us and saved us. We cannot understand eternity. Everything we know has had a beginning and will have an end. Everything. The concept of eternity is not understandable to us at all. Everything we know changes. Everything. Except Jesus. The author of the Epistle to the Hebrews says, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

What does that mean for us? On the day that Adam and Eve first sinned – on the very same day – God came to them and promised that He would make it all right – that He would send a Savior to cover the sin that Adam and Eve had committed. It took some 4000 years, but God kept His promise. He sticks to His commitment. He doesn't change from the plan. Certainly, there were many who gave up on God. They worried – or were maybe even sure – that God had changed His mind – that there was no Messiah coming after all. There were Christians in the New Testament who thought the promise that Jesus would return was also changed. They thought – or hoped – that Jesus would return while they were still living. But Jesus has not changed that promise. He will come back. That will NOT change.

Among some of the pictures and papers that were among my mother's many "collections," there was this little book, written for the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of St. Peter's. The author is not named anywhere that I could find. It was done in a style of writing that we don't use so much today – a little more "flowery." Some of you have read this, maybe have a copy. I believe the written history of the congregation has been updated since this was published, but I found some interesting stuff in this one. I'm sure I read it before, but I noticed things that I had not remembered.

The message that this congregation has heard and lived with for 150 years has not changed. The message of salvation in Jesus Christ is the same as it was when the congregation started. It is the same timeless message that the true Church has had since it began. But the delivery has changed. The manner in which the Word has been preached has changed. The way the congregation worships and carries on its business has changed. But the message is the same. Jesus Christ is the same now as He was 150 years ago and the same that He will be as far in the future as we can think.

In the earliest days of St. Peter's history, things moved quite rapidly. According to this little book, the first German Lutheran settlers seemed to appear in the Belvidere neighborhood in about 1866. Worship was important to them and the closest opportunity for them was happening in Hay Creek. That congregation had been established in 1858 – the same year that Minnesota became a state. Pastor Horst was serving the faithful at Hay Creek in the late 1860's. After a time, those who were living in this neighborhood asked Pr. Horst if he would bring worship to them. They would worship in one of their homes. House worship was part of the Church since the earliest days. We hear about it in the Book of Acts. Those home worship services in the

Belvidere neighborhood started in 1871 or 2. Soon these worshippers wanted to establish their own congregation. On February 9, 1873, the Constitution of St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Congregation of Belvidere was signed by those charter members. The names of those signatures are names that are still part of this congregation even though the descendants may not carry that name. It shows names like Rusch, Brunkorst, Schmidt, Fitschen, Brinkmann, Mickow, Tomhave, Bolland Boesch, Martens, Meincke, Holst, Burfeind, Hoffman. Some of you can trace your heritage back to those original members. When the congregation celebrated its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, only one of the charter members was still alive, and I believe that was my great-great-grandfather, Christopher Rusch.

As soon as the congregation had been established, change started. Later in that same year, they started to realize that their numbers were too large to meet in homes. That first church was 16 by 26 feet. Some homes today have living rooms that are that large. By the time the first called pastor was installed in December of 1874, the congregation had built a parsonage as well.

Many congregations in our LCMS have come to a point that they need to come together with another congregation in order to have the necessary resources. St. Peter's has been together with Bethany – again – since the early 2000's. But the history of the congregation tells us that, like many other congregations in the day, for much of St. Peter's history, it was not a congregation served alone by its pastor. The first called pastor, Pastor Christian Maurer served congregations at Chester, Jacksonville and Lincoln as well as Belvidere. During those years, it seems that worship was held on alternate Sundays – Jacksonville and Lincoln on one Sunday, St. Peter's and Chester on the next. It wasn't until the 1940's that Jacksonville and Lincoln were not served by the pastor from St. Peter's and St. Peter's and Chester became a dual parish with worship every Sunday. Chester closed and soon Bethany began and it wasn't until the 1950's that St. Peter's had a pastor all to themselves, Pastor Walter Zemke. The point of all this sharing all this history is to remind us that things in the Church are always changing. Neighborhoods change, families change, roads change. Congregations, especially rural ones were established to minister to the people that lived near the church. Now people think nothing of driving past another couple churches to worship in their congregation.

Another area that has seen great change is how Christian education is provided. From its earliest days, teaching the faith to the young in preparation for Confirmation was of primary importance. It sounds like the first school at St. Peter's was taught by pastor and didn't offer much more than instruction in the faith. Later, it was realized that time spent at school needed to include "readin', writin' and 'rithmatic." It was not until 1945 that the school year at St. Peter's was a full nine-month term. Instruction had changed from German to English not too many years before that. The white frame building on the west edge of the property – the second school building – was built in 1902, the brick building on the back of the church in 1961. Changes in demographics eventually closed the school and Christian education is accomplished in other ways – changes.

There are many other changes that have occurred through the years. The first two churches were, of course, used before electricity was available to light the building. Since 1946, all services have been in English rather than German. Different organizations have come and gone – all with a purpose for the times – but changes come to those things too.

And we can be sure that changes will keep coming. Farms have continually gotten larger and the neighborhood around this church is no longer mostly German. Many in our society find less reason to be involved in a church at all. They want no influence in their lives from the Scriptures. The number who indicate "none" as their religious preference gets larger with each survey. Artificial Intelligence or "AI" is the current buzzword. If you believe what they say about that, we will soon have computers doing our thinking for us. Much of current social, educational and economic thought is quite scary for many of us. Not only are things destined to keep changing, it seems like change is happening faster than ever.

At a celebration like this, we are giving thanks for the many years of blessings that our gracious God has bestowed on this congregation and its people. Many have been the opportunities to share the Gospel with our families, our neighbors and the world at large. We give thanks to have been part of the Gospel mission for 150 years. Certainly, much has changed – and much will change in the coming days and years. But we are confident that our gracious Savior will continue to bless His people as He has in the past and as He is doing now and has promised for the future.

I asked that two things be included in this service. I asked that the Gospel reading be from Matthew 16 - those well-known words of Peter's confession. Perhaps the first minutes of this congregation's business would give us some insight into the reasoning for choosing to name the congregation after St. Peter. Perhaps there were already some congregations around that were named St. John's and Trinity and Immanuel - and they didn't want to get people confused. I'd like to believe that they chose to name their new congregation after St. Peter because his was the first strong confession in the Scriptures of Jesus as the Messiah. Most were terribly confused about who Jesus was at that point and that confusion would continue until the Holy Spirit arrived on the faithful at Pentecost. Peter is well known for his brashness and his boldness. Perhaps he spoke what the rest of the disciples were thinking - perhaps not, but what he confessed, "You are the Christ the Son of the Living God" was revealed to Peter by God the Father Himself. His confession didn't come from His own thinking – it was divine revelation. I'd like to believe that the founders of this congregation were aware of what Peter had said and wanted to be part of that kind of brave and strong confession. Before that confession, Peter's name had been Simon – a good name which means "the listener" or "he who has heard." After Peter's bold confession, Jesus added to Simon's name. "Peter" comes from the Greek word for "rock." It is on the rock of Peter's confession that Christ said His Church should be built. 150 years ago, the founding fathers of this congregation chose that name, Peter, the Rock, to be the foundation for this congregation. 150 years later, this congregation is still built on the Rock of Faith, the Rock of Christ, the Rock of Salvation.

The second thing I asked to be included in the service was the hymn, "Abide with Me." Certainly it is a familiar and favorite hymn for many. The final verse, where we ask that the cross be our vision as we close our eyes for the final time is a moving and faith-filled set of words. But it is the fourth verse that I want to re-emphasize this afternoon:

Swift to its close ebbs out life's little day; Earth's joys grow dim, its glories pass away; Change and decay in all around I see; O Thou who changest not, abide with me.

The words of that verse perhaps give a negative view of change, putting it together with decay. Change has happened. Change will continue to happen, but our Savior and His love for us will never change. And He will abide with us until He takes us to the home in heaven that He is preparing for us.

It has been an honor and a privilege to be with you this afternoon. My membership left St. Peter's back in 1970, but this congregation will always be a place that I give thanks for – for the beginning of faith that was worked in me here. There are others of you out there who are like me – former members drawn back to celebrate. But there are also a goodly number of you who are working to do the work of the Gospel in this place today, carrying on the mission started by those faithful German settlers back in 1873. We give thanks for them and for the many who have come since then. We give thanks for this congregation today and for the faithful confession that is still being made. May God bless St. Peter's Lutheran Church of Belvidere.
