(December 24, 2023)

Isaiah 7:10-14

1 John 4:7–16

Matthew 1:18-25

The Word of the Lord Is Fulfilled in the Flesh of Jesus

Though Ahaz would not ask, the Lord gives a sign to the House of David — "the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel" (Is. 7:14). With this promise, He signifies that salvation is by His grace alone. It is no work or achievement of man, but the Lord's own work and His free gift. The promise is fulfilled as the Son of God is conceived and born of the Virgin Mary, and the sign is received in faith by the House of David in the person of Joseph (Matt. 1:20–24). "Incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary" (Nicene Creed), God is with us (Immanuel) in the flesh of Jesus, Mary's Son. Joseph believes that Word of God and so demonstrates a marvelous example in his immediate and quiet obedience, taking Mary to be his wife and caring for her in faith and love. He loves her because the love of God is manifest in this, that "the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world," to be "the propitiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10–14).

Titus 2:11–14

Luke 2:1-14 (15-20)

The Light of Christ Shines Forth in the Darkness

Heaven and earth rejoice this night because the glory of the holy Triune God is manifested in the human birth of "our great God and Savior Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13). In Him, the Father's grace, mercy and peace rest upon the world. The silence of death is broken by this "good news of great joy that will be for all the people" (Luke 2:10). And all we who have gone astray like lost and wandering sheep, who have "walked in darkness" of doubt and fear and sinful unbelief, behold "a great light" in the nativity of Christ (Is. 9:2). In Him "the grace of God has appeared" (Titus 2:11). For this child of Mary who is born for us, this dear Son of God who is given to us, bears the burden of our sin and death in His own body to the cross. He thereby establishes a government of peace, "with justice and with righteousness," which shall have no end; not by any work of man, but "the zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this" (Is. 9:7).

Christ Jesus Reveals Himself in the Signs He Has Given to His Church

The Lord has not forsaken us. He has come to us and sought us out to save us (Is. 62:11–12), "so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life" (Titus 3:7). In Christ Jesus, conceived and born of Mary, "the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared" (Titus 3:4). Now He is lifted up in the Gospel, "a signal over the peoples" (Is. 62:10), that He might call us to rejoice in His salvation. St. Luke emphasizes the signs by which the shepherds once found Him: in Bethlehem, the City of David, "wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger" (Luke 2:12). The same Lord Jesus reveals Himself to us in the sure and certain signs of His Gospel. His Church is a true Bethlehem (House of Bread); for the Son of David, "a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11), feeds us with His body and His blood from the manger of His altar, wrapped in swaddling cloths of bread and wine. Let us ponder these mysteries and, like the shepherds, go about our vocations, "glorifying and praising God" (Luke 2:19–20).

The Living and Life-Giving Word of God Dwells Among Us in the Flesh

The Lord sends out His ministers of the Gospel to make disciples "of all the nations," so that "all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God." For the Lord has "bared his holy arm" in the incarnate Christ (Is. 52:7, 10). The child in the manger, born of the Virgin Mary, is the very Word of God, the only begotten Son of the Father, "whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world" (Heb. 1:2). As "all things were made through him" (John 1:3), so are all things redeemed and made new in Him. In His body of flesh and blood, we behold "the radiance of the glory of God" (Heb. 1:3), "glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). He dwells among us in peace, that we might have life and light and salvation in Him. For by His Word of the Gospel, we are born again as the children of God, bearing His name and sharing His eternal life.

Treasures' Report: Read and approved

Financial Secretary's Report: One clarification and name change – The convention fund should be the youth convention fund. It was money left after the last convention. It was then approved.

Trustee's: General maintenance was done in the church. The parking lot will be repaired the week of Oct.10th. The cost was said to be \$4,730, There will be no parking until it is finished and dried. The door to the Pastors office on the northeast side will be open during office hours. The carpeted area of the church is in need of repair. It is a tripping hazard as it is buckled in several places. The replacement would be carpet tiles that could individually be replaced if needed. The June estimate was \$10,022 from Tony's of Wabasha. The Thrivent money could be used to pay some of the cost. The congregation voted to go ahead with the carpet project. The fellowship hall will be stripped and waxed the week of the 15th- 20th. Furniture will be moved after church on the 15th.

Elders: There will be regular quarterly meetings with Pastor and the Bethany and St. Peter Elders. Education: There is no lower grade Sunday school. Hopefully there will be a preschool program next year. There are two 6th graders taught by Michelle Roberson, five 7th graders and 2 eight 8th graders taught by Pastor. There will be prayer partners assigned to these students. There is joint youth group with St. Peters.

Discipleship: The Block Party netted \$1350 to support Sarah Parrish on her 2-year mission journey to Costa Rica. The Garage Sale netted approximately \$1650 to be divided between two local youth missions. Half will go to Packing for the Weekend and the other half to the Lincoln High School Pantry. Both organizations support local youth in need. The anniversary planning is going well. Please spread the word to family and friends that have been past members here.

Pastor's Report: Confirmation with Pastor has started for 7th and 8th graders and the 6th graders are studying ways to share what they believe and answer questions their peers may ask. One funeral was performed for Eva Gnotke.

New Business: The 2024 budget was presented and explained. The Pastor gets a \$30,000 housing allowance as part of his salary for tax purposes. The Bethany St. Peters split will change to 55% Bethany and 45% St. Peters. With some small raises and a few increases for inflation the budget was passed at \$188,224. The congregation voted to hold the quarterly meetings after the service to give more people input.
