There is something about seasons, isn't there? You may be reading this in a southern climate that doesn't change much, but if you've ever been up north, you know what I'm talking about. There is nothing like a good thunderstorm and soaking rain. The buildup of clouds on the horizon is an awesome sight. A large dump of snow blankets everything with white and is followed by calmness after the storm. The glistening of each individually created snowflake in the sunshine is a joy to behold. Dec 21st, the shortest day of the year, is my favorite, because it means warmer and sunnier days are ahead. Watching new life come from the earth and animals in spring is like that first big breath in the morning. It is so uplifting and refreshing. There is nothing like the change of seasons.

In this hymn, we sing about tempests raging. When you look at the world around you, you see God's handiwork in all of creation, even in the most desolate places. When storms come, they can cause much damage and people may even die. That kind of tempest can be extremely scary.

But when it comes to tempests, think about your own life. Think about the brokenness in your own relationships with others and with God. The wintry blast can be that cold shoulder from someone we thought was on our side but has turned against us. But have we been better ourselves, especially in the way we honor God? Every time we do something bad or leave something undone, we rage against Him with our sin. This is exactly what Adam and Eve did. God the Father walked with them in the garden. They had the perfect relationship with Him! They were in His presence daily and had everything they would ever need. But they still rebelled. They thought they knew better.

Creation groans. Storms destroy. Death has come and continues to take lives. But like the change of seasons, this life will "soon be overpast." Just like death seemingly destroyed Jesus, His time in the grave was quickly over when He rose triumphant on Easter.

St. John calls us to keep all things in perspective (John 12:25). We can certainly enjoy this life and God's creation. But if we live in a way that tries to make life perfect, pouring all of our resources into it like an idol, we ignore the harsh truth that everything in this world will pass away. Everything will be gone the collectibles, the bank account, the perfect yard and home...all of it.

What doesn't pass away? The Word of the Lord. God comforts us that His Word endures forever (Is. 40:8), so His promises to you will never fade away. In dying and rising with Christ, we have this unchanging promise of eternal life. We will be given new bodies, bodies just like that of Jesus when He rose from death. We will live in a new heaven and a new earth. We will again walk with God and we will see Him face to face.

So what do we do today? We can thank God for the life He gives us. We take refuge, no matter our circumstances, in the sure and certain hope that Christ has redeemed us. Indeed, He has redeemed all of creation, and has promised us a heavenly home with Him.



#### UPDATES FROM THE FIELD:

ACTIVITIES ACROSS THE REGION...

The year burst into action with a flurry of activities. From February through the end of August, I am taking on additional responsibilities while our regional director embarks on a study leave. Alongside my colleague Britt Odemba, we continue to serve as our region's volunteer coordinators, a task we embrace with unwavering enthusiasm and dedication despite the whirlwind of tasks. Across the continent, theological educators have been busy imparting knowledge in seminaries and training centers in Madagascar, Uganda, and Tanzania. Among the highlights in January was hosting the second in-person course for the Concordia Seminary St. Louis Masters online program in our field office. Dr. Peter Nafzger led an enriching one-week intensive on preaching, complemented by a workshop tailored for local Kenya Lutheran pastors. Witnessing the camaraderie among students during face-to-face interactions was truly heartwarming.

Immediately following the class, we welcomed a new missionary family, the Paynes. Following their arrival, they underwent a week of field orientation in Kenya before embarking on their journey to Tanzania for language acquisition. Rev. Bryan and Deaconess Keah Payne will serve at the newly established seminary in Shinyanga. We look forward to them getting settled into life and ministry there.

#### AGRICULTURAL CONSULTANCY IN SIERRA LEONE...

I traveled to Sierra Leone in February to lead the Agricultural consultancy team. The Agricultural consultancy team has mainly served in East Africa for the past 12-plus years. The main focus of the Agricultural Consultancy team is to share the love of our Lord Jesus Christ with our brothers and sisters in Christ through teaching and encouraging church leaders and church members to adopt sustainable agricultural practices and management of their resources, thereby bringing the blessing of helping them and their neighbors to improve and protect their property and business. Through face-to-face contact in villages, the Ag consultancy teams train people to better manage their crop production, protect and improve their soils, practice improved storage and marketing of crops, and work together in harmony as our Lord desires. This team to Sierra Leone consisted of veteran missionaries Ralph and Sharon Von Qualen and Gwen Zagore.

Our time in Sierra Leone was filled with opportunities to deepen our understanding of the Lutheran Church and its current agricultural methods. Throughout our visits to various regions and the seminary, the team taught about Management of the Harvest and Soil Fertility, Wise Management, and How to Start a Small Business. We gained insights into local agricultural practices during a visit to a cassava farm and the Ag. consultants were able to advise on how to stop the spread of disease in the plants. The team also made a great connection with the dean of the School of Agriculture and Food Science at Njala University. He will be a good resource for the church as they put into practice some of the techniques that were shared.

#### VISITORS TO AFRICA...

In March, we welcomed several visitors to the region. Mr. Zach Schnare from the Mission Advancement office at the International Center was a first-time visitor to Africa. His itinerary included visits to various ministries and the seminary in Kenya, Tanzania, South Africa, and Ghana, as well as attending our regional retreat. These visits are instrumental in providing mission advancement representatives with firsthand insights into the ministries and projects in the Africa region, enhancing their ability to advocate on our behalf. Additionally, we were delighted to host Rev. Heder Piepe Gumz, the Vice President of Missionary Expansion for our partner church in Brazil, Igreja Evangélica Luterana do Brasil (The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Brazil). He met with Alliance missionaries serving in Ethiopia, Kenya, and South Africa. This afforded him a firsthand look into their ministries and an opportunity to visit our Africa field office and engage in discussions about our collaborative efforts. His visit fostered mutual appreciation and encouragement, strengthening our relationship. It is a blessing for us to serve as part of God's mission and to share His mission with you.
